OUR RELATIONS WITH CHINA.

Professor Woolsey describes briefly the effect of the various treaties which have been signed by the two countries, and shows China's limitations as a power, owing to her inability to enforce respect. He points out the courses open to the United States if her commerce is to be extended in China, and the part to be played by Hawaii and the Philippines in effecting this extension.
