James D. Eakin, a merchant and one of the original one hundred members of the Cotton Exchange, killed himself yesterday afternoon in his office, 43 Exchange place, by shooting himself in the back. The pistol was a new one and all the chambers had been loaded. The rim of three of the five unexploded cartridges bore indications of the hammer.
