TURNED DOWN MR. DURAND. The C. F. U. Refuses Information to a Member of the U. S. Industrial Commission.


The Central Federated Union put itself on record yesterday as refusing to give the United States Industrial Commission information which it sought regarding strikes, wages, hours of work, and so forth.
