

BIG CROWD AT REGATTA.

THOUSANDS PERSONS WITNESSED EXCITING RACES FOR AQUATIC SUPREMACY.

Quaker City Oarsmen Win Five of Fourteen Events on the Speedway Course—Francis of Troy a Fine Sculler—New York A. C. Defeats Columbia and Seven Other Crews.

Thousand persons testified to their appreciation of the new Speedway course on the Harlem by turning out to witness the thirty-fifth annual regatta of the Harlem Regatta Association yesterday afternoon.

They enjoyed a full day's sport, for the racing, which was scheduled to begin at 10 o'clock in the morning, did not end until 7 o'clock at night.

Philadelphia sent on a strong contingent, which met with fair success in the effort to wrest aquatic honors from the local oarsmen of the visiting clubs the Vespers were the strategy and only one of the regatta crews was defeated, while three of the most coveted association trophies were taken back to the Quaker City by their men.

The same sculler with E. Hedley as a partner won the grand challenge cup for senior doubles and the Vespers completed their list of victories by retaining possession after the Philadelphia regatta.

The Philadelphia regatta was the first of a series of regattas which will be held during the summer months.

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HOME FOR CONSUMPTIVES.

Redford, May 30.—A special train from New York and Harlem Railroad brought a large crowd here today to attend the opening of the Country Sanitarium for Consumptives, a Jewish but non-sectarian institution, which is to be conducted in connection with the Montefiore Home in Broadway.

The new sanitarium is the result of a permanent work, which has been carried on at Redford for several years, and through its establishment for the treatment of consumptives the directors expect not only to save thousands of lives directly by curing patients, but to extend the work to a still larger scale by taking the uneducated and untrained consumptive from his unsanitary environment, thus preventing him from infecting his own kin and neighbors.
