

CUBANS TALK OF CHANGES. SOME DELEGATES NOW OPPOSE TO UNIVERSAL SUFFRAGE. Others Say It Will Make No Difference, as Means Will Be Found to Suppress the Negro and Illiterate Vote—Planners of the Convention.

HAYANA, June 15.—Some of the delegates to the Constitutional Convention are considering the advisability of making an attempt to alter certain clauses of the Cuban Constitution among others those referring to universal suffrage and to the personal responsibility of the secretaries of the President for all their acts.

A radical delegate to the convention is quoted as saying: "Better leave that question alone, as ways can be found to prevent the negroes and other illiterate portions of the population from voting."

Other delegates think the question a serious one, as universal suffrage will tend to mark the difference between the whites and blacks more than ever. It is said that these parties are being formed on the color line.

The Planners' Association has published a protest against the decree which settled the mortgage question. The protest says, among other things: "We protest against the order, and if the opportunity comes some day when we can get redress for the damages said order will cause us to do so."

FURNISHING A TROLLEY ROAD. Tracks Laid Over a Marsh Between South Beach and Midland Beach. While the police and city authorities were restrained by a temporary injunction issued by Justice Wilmet M. Smith a hundred track layers and laborers worked throughout Friday night and yesterday building a double track trolley road across the meadows between South and Midland beaches on Station Island. The Southfield Beach Railroad Company, which is building this line of railroad, secured title in fee simple to all of the land over which its tracks were to be laid, and several weeks ago began making the roadbed across the marshland which separates the two beaches and has cut off communication on between them, except by a long drive or trolley ride through the interior of the island.

The work had been done for nearly half the distance some time ago when progress was blocked by the police acting under the orders of the Highway Department, which asserted that there was no authority for the laying of tracks. Burgher and Scoville avenues, leading across the marsh to the bay, and a road which the railroad company had obtained no franchise or consent, the railroad company finding no respect for that they had become such through general use for twenty years.

Two representatives of the Highway Department and one of the railroad company appeared on the scene, and when the contractor was ready to begin work on the line the Highway Department officers, under the temporary injunction obtained by Counsel Morgan J. Smith, which restrained the officers of the city of New York, the Highway Department and the railroad company, from interfering with the progress of the work.

A CRUDE WIRELESS TELEPHONE. Set an 18-Year-Old Clerk Says It Works—Current Through the Ground. Samuel P. Lovenberg, an eighteen-year-old helper employed by the New York Telephone Company, alleges that he has invented a wireless telephone.
