The police searched Mrs. Nagel's rooms and found a revolver in a closet in the kitchen. None of the neighbors in the house heard shots fired. The detectives learned that Mrs. Nagel's husband had not been at home for two days.

Mrs. Nagel made an ante-mortem statement to the Coroner last night. She said that she had a quarrel with her husband at 10 o'clock yesterday morning.
