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NEPHEW CROKER RAPS POLICE

SAYS THEY'RE NEGLIGENT ON THE LATE TOURS.

Big Fire Yesterday Had Been Burning for an Hour Before the Department knew it—It's an Outrage, Says He—Not First Time He's Complained.

Fire Chief Croker, nephew of the Squire of Waikiki, severely arraigned the police force and the three-platoon system yesterday morning after a \$25,000 fire in Fitzgerald's paper and rag warehouse at 208 and 209 West street.

When the police were divided into three platoons by Commissioner Murphy he said that the city would be afforded better police protection, especially at night.
