FRENCH WARSHIP SENT.

The Tago Sails From New Orleans for St. Pierre—Martiniquans in Her Crew.

NEW ORLEANS, May 10.—The Tago, flagship of the French Atlantic squadron, with Vice-Admiral Servan in command, arrived here on May 1 from St. Pierre, Martinique, where she had been stationed for several weeks.

Admiral Servan received orders from France to leave New Orleans at once, and the Tago will pull out at midnight to-night or between midnight and daylight.
