COAL STRIKE'S REAL MEANING

SHALL MINERS OPERATORS CONTROL THE MINES?

The Strike of 1900 Was Simply a Preliminary Move Toward Deciding This Great Question—Present Contest Has Been Anticipated by Both Sides.

WILKES-BARRE, May 21.—To secure an understanding of the situation in the anthracite coal region it is necessary to grasp the fact that the fight now on is the same fight of which the strike of 1900 was only the preliminary skirmish.

For reasons that in no manner touched the question then at issue, concessions were made by the coal operators which the mine workers' union, of which Mr. Mitchell is President, proclaimed as a victory and which the public in general interpreted as such.

From Oct. 27, 1900, when the makeshift peace was patched up, until the day when the present strike was voted by the United Mine Workers' Convention at Hazleton, both sides were maneuvering for the conference and the talks and the mediation debates in New York meant nothing.

There is no presidential election now pending to give the United Mine Workers a slight reprieve. If they win this time it will be a victory of sheer strength and skill.
