

KEENE COLORS TWICE IN FRONT

INJUNCTION AND SOUTHWAY WIN AT LONG ODDS

Former Taker of the Manhattan Stakes From Mr. Voorhes—One Favorite Successful in Seven Races—Jockey Jackson Hurt.

The well-known colors of the Keenes were carried to victory at Gravesend yesterday afternoon by two horses that were not seriously considered by the betting public and the students of racing form. The winners were both two-year-olds, Injunction, a chestnut colt by St. Leonards—Prohibition II, sired by the Manhattan Stakes winner, and Southway, a bay colt by Mr. Voorhes, sired by the Manhattan Stakes winner.

The Manhattan Stakes at five furlongs was the feature and though August Belmont's Fire Eater, P. J. Dwyer's Arcturion and a Featherstone's Peeper were scratched, the race did not start. In the second race, a mile, the favorite, Injunction, was ridden by the veteran jockey, Jackson, who was hurt in the race. Injunction won by a narrow margin. Large fields prevailed and to pick a winner required unusual acumen and nerve.
