**HIS DEBT ON WALL SIGNS.**  
FELLENHAUER WANTS \$7.50, NO MATTER WHO KNOWS IT.

So He Decorates the Wall With Legends Regarding That Little Matter Which His Dilatory Debtor, or He Who Hums, May Read—No Effect Thus Far.

Lotus Fellenhauer, who has a small cigar store at 103 Greenwich street, wants \$7.50, which he says he loaned to the brother of a former landlord. Fellenhauer's cigar store was formerly at 216 Fulton street. He was there for six years and when he moved last May he was still owing the \$7.50, he says. After waiting awhile Fellenhauer took matters into his own hands. Back of his store on Greenwich street is a small court with high walls. Fellenhauer utilized the walls. When his debtor looked out of a rear window of 216 Fulton street one morning a few months ago his eye caught this notice, printed in big letters on the wall:

THE NEXT MORNING curiosity prompted him to look at the wall again. This time he read:

\$7.50 GIVEN TO ME BY THE DEBTOR.

Since then Fellenhauer has changed his signs weekly to such notices as:

1. I will pay that \$7.50 I'll turn it over to you.

2. I will go out of business before I would owe you \$7.50.

Fellenhauer was planning another sign when he was seen yesterday. He had about given up all hope of getting the money, he said.

"It is a shame," he said, "that \$7.50 was good cold cash, loaned money. I guess I'll now laughing away with these signs until something happens."

Fellenhauer's last sign reads:

LAST CALL FOR THAT \$7.50. PAY UP AND AVOID TROUBLE.

AT THE VERMONT SHRINE.

Marble Group of the Pieta, or Our Lady of Martyrs, to Be Unveiled Today.

ASTORIA, N. Y., Aug. 23.—To-morrow there will be a remarkable ceremony at the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs at Astoria. On the site of the first mission to the Indians in this State a pavilion has been erected in the form of a Greek temple, or shrine, including a marble group, representing the Saviour, after he was taken down from the cross, supported by his mother. The group is known as the Pieta, or Our Lady of Martyrs. It is in marble and has been carved especially for the shrine after the famous design of Acheron, in the Vatican. It was made in Carrara, Italy. The crown of thorns which is usually represented with this group has been worked in gold, the vestments of the figures who have visited Astoria on pilgrimages.

The Rev. Thomas R. A. Burke, D. D., of Albany, will say mass and preach in the chapel. The Rev. Father Burke will travel and bless the new statue and place the crown on it. The Rev. T. J. Campbell, S. J., of New York, will preach the sermon. Special trains will run over the West Shore road and pilgrims will be present from New York, Albany and Troy and from cities all along the Hudson above Poughkeepsie. Pilgrims will also be present in large numbers from the towns along the Mohawk Valley. It is expected that several thousand persons will witness the ceremony.

McORMACK ACCUSED OF BIGAMY.

Married a Woman in Glen Falls, When He Had a Wife in Orange, N. J.

GLEN FALLS, N. Y., Aug. 23.—Mrs. John McCormack and sister, Miss Ellen Burnett, of Orange, N. J., came here yesterday and accused the arrest of Mrs. McCormack's husband on a charge of bigamy. They were married in the Church of St. John the Apostle in Orange, in June, 1903. They soon went to New York, where Mr. McCormack had always lived, and stayed there until three years ago, when he came to Warrensburg, near here, to work in a factory as a shirt cutter, leaving his wife behind. He visited her at intervals, the last time being in April, 1901. In the following July he married Miss Ellen Cronin of the village.

McCormack will be held for the Grand Jury and both women will appear against him. The first wife has been married for years ago, and the second wife has a five-month-old son. McCormack, who is well connected in New York and Orange, will make no statement.

QUESTION MARK IN THE SKY.

Superstitious People in Wichita Alarmed by a Cloud Formation.

WICHITA, Kan., Aug. 23.—At sunset last evening a peculiar combination of dark clouds whipped the shoulder of a wind cloud bank on the southwestern horizon of Wichita and carried it northward until other wind currents stopped it. In the contact of the opposing winds the cloud fragment was thrown into a perfect question mark, which hung dark in front of an effulgent setting sun for nearly ten minutes. While the average citizen gazed on the silhouette with admiration and wonder at the accident of its perfect formation at that time and place, some superstitious persons manifested their alarm in various ways, principally by falling upon their knees and praying. The scene is now over, and everybody understands that the creation was purely accidental.

Grand Duke's Chicago Visit Prolonged.

CHICAGO, Aug. 23.—Grand Duke Boris of Russia has postponed his departure from Chicago for the East indefinitely, owing to the illness of Chevalier de Schaack, his personal attaché. The patient has some symptoms of typhoid fever and a physician is in constant attendance on him in his apartments at the Auditorium Hotel.

**NO MORE SKIPPING MAIL BOXES.**

Brooklyn Postmaster Has a Scheme to Prevent Collectors Skirting.

In order to prevent his mail collectors from skipping letter boxes on their routes, Postmaster Roberts of Brooklyn is to have installed in each box a small indicator, which will tell the hour of each collection.

When the collector arrives at a box he will be compelled to turn the hand of the indicator to the hour of the next collection. The indicators will be placed where the public can see them and the Postmaster will request citizens to make complaints where they do not register properly.

The indicators will cost the Government about \$1 each and will be installed inside of a month.

**Struck by a Train and Killed.**

NYACK, N. Y., Aug. 23.—John Shakespear, an aged and well-to-do resident of Nyack, was struck by a train on the Northern Railroad of New Jersey at South Nyack early this evening and instantly killed. Mr. Shakespear was born in England nearly eighty years ago. He was an expert jeweler and watchmaker and made an ample competency. A year ago he celebrated the fiftieth anniversary of his wedding. He is survived by his widow, two sons, David and William, and three daughters, Mrs. James Patterson of New York, Mrs. Howard R. Browne of South Nyack and Mrs. Frank P. Demarest, wife of former Assemblyman Democrat of West Nyack.
