

PRESIDENT AGAIN ON TRUSTS.

DESTROY THE EVIL IN THEM. HIS THEME.

Do Not Take No Hasty Action That May Endanger the Good—Insists That Power of Control Should Be Fixed Some Place—Thinks Something May Be Done by National Legislation—Vigorous Speech at Fitchburg—Starts Home Tonight.

DALTON, Mass., Sept. 2.—President Roosevelt's first long speech of the day was at Fitchburg this morning and he had something more to say as to his programme for the control of corporations. It was in the form of an answer to those who have criticised the President's recent utterances. As was said in the despatches sent to the Six early in the present tour through New England, the first comment received by the President after his speech at Providence and Boston was that he had been "hunted" by the press everywhere he went.

THE PRESIDENT EXPLAINS.

As a change, tactics change, but the spirit that makes the real success does not change. (Applause.) The spirit that makes for victory does not change. It is just so in civic life. The problems are different, but fundamentally the qualities needed to face them in the average citizen are the same and our new and highly complex industrial civilization has produced a new and complicated series of problems. We need to face these problems and not to run away from them.
