ARMY-NAVY FOOTBALL TROUBLE.

Officers at Annapolis Will Insist on Eligibility Rules.

ANNAPOLIS, Jan. 9.—Sentiment is practically unanimous among naval officers that unless West Point agrees to the adoption of eligibility rules governing future contracts between the Military and Naval academies that it is better to discontinue the contests.

They assert that the fact that students are by law admitted to West Point who are two years older than those at Annapolis makes the comparison entirely unfair.

Commander W. F. Halley, secretary of the Naval Athletic Association, says that the matter is being discussed by the students who compose the Yale and Harvard football teams this season, only one was included to enter West Point, while there was only one of the twenty-two young enough to be eligible to enter Annapolis.
