HOME WORKERS IN TENEMENTS. 27,000 of Them in This City—Earnings of Men and Women.
ALBANY, Feb. 22.—The annual report of Commissioner of Labor John McMeekin which will be transmitted to the Legislature tomorrow under the heading of "Earnings of Home Workers in New York City Tenements," shows that the workers on clothing comprise more than 23,000 of the entire 27,000 persons who at last accounts were in the licensed family workrooms in New York City.

The average earnings among the male home workers was \$260 for the first six months of 1922, but nearly two-thirds of them (86 out of 157) were skilled workmen (tailors) employed in making the entire garment. The average earnings of male home workers, who had an average of one helper apiece, amounted to only \$213 for the six months. This was supplemented by outside earnings of other members of the family, so that the total family income on the average to \$268 in the first half of the year 1922, which was further increased to \$274 by the letting of lodgings, etc.

26 PRISONERS FROM BATHS.
Police Heads and Jerome Interested in Raid.
Policemen Have Been Preparing the Place for a Week Getting Evidence—Fifty-five of 58 Bathmen Found There Let Go After Precautions.

The Russian and Turkish baths in part of the basement of the Ariston, a two-story brick and stone apartment hotel at the northeast corner of Broadway and Fifty-fifth street, were cleaned out by the police at 1 o'clock yesterday morning. They found seventy-eight men there and arrested twenty-six for felony or disorderly conduct. With the raiders were Inspector Brooks, Acting Inspector Walsh, Capt. Schmittberger of the West Forty-seventh street station, in whose precinct the place is; Capt. Langan of the Detective Bureau and a number of policemen in uniform or plain clothes. Police Commissioner Greco sent his secretary, W. S. Coursey.

Long before the first prisoner was arraigned in the West Side police court in the morning, a lawyer was making frantic inquiries about a prisoner who had given his name as "Moses Beck." The lawyer asserted that "Beck" was a wealthy and reputable merchant and that if he had been caught in the raid it was a most horrible misfortune. When Capt. Schmittberger heard him he called a couple of the plain-clothes men who had been in the place several times and they talked with the lawyer. After they disappeared he was arrested.
