WASHINGTON, April 13.—With the exception of the third race, the talent swept the card at Bunnys today with the exception of the favorites. The weather was perfect for racing, the track very fast and the crowd one of the largest of the meeting.

The second event, for two-year-olds at four and a half furlongs, created particular interest from the fact that C. Fellows, Jr., Garrett Wilson and John E. Madden's Auction were equal favorites at 2 to 1.

Frank Farrell's First Born was almost well favored at 1 1/2 with stakes about 2 to 1. H. H. Hittcock's Billy Wish, Wish, Garrett Wilson and Auction ran like a team to the head of the stretch, First Born and Pygmalion close behind them.

Garrett Wilson and Auction drew away and fought it out to the wire in a fierce drive, the former getting the verdict by a head in 1:07 1/2. Pygmalion, 2 to 1, was third, six lengths away. The winner's head bet up to \$1,200, his owner refusing to let him go.

James Bluff started both Toscan and Sals in the fourth race at six and a half furlongs, the pair being coupled at the prohibitive odds of 4 to 1. Toscan was declared the favorite, but he led all the way with Sals galloping close to him. They finished one, two, Toscan a head in front, aimed in 1:24 3/4.
