REPORT MALARIA CASES.

The Board of Health Would Like a Chance to Hunt the Mosquito That Bit You.

The Board of Health, having started its spring war on mosquitoes, issued a statement yesterday requesting doctors to notify the department of all cases of malarial fever which come under their observation.

In most instances the occurrence of a case of malarial fever in a certain locality means the existence close by of a breeding place of the Anopheles (the mosquito which carries the malarial parasite), and if all cases of malarial fever are reported, it will be easy thing to investigate the surrounding locality for breeding places and stamp them out.

This will not only greatly reduce the number of cases of malaria, but the spread of the disease from one part of the community to another. It is now a part of the routine work of the Department of Health to make free microscopic examinations of the blood for the malarial parasite, and any physician can have such an investigation made on request.

THE DEPARTMENT'S STATEMENT CONTAINS DIRECTIONS FOR PUTTING OUT STAGNANT PONDS AND THE POINTERS ON HOW TO AVOID MALARIA.

As a safeguard against malarial fever it is interesting to know that the Anopheles, unlike the Culex (the ordinary non-malarial mosquito), flies and bites only after sunset or in extremely shady spots. For this reason, if houses are carefully screened, there is little danger of being bitten by the pest even in a malarial community.

JOHN J. DUNN A SUICIDE.

New York Inventor of a Metallic Compound Mills Himself in Mobile.

MOBILE, Ala., April 20.—John J. Dunn, well known in New York as an inventor, committed suicide to-day by shooting himself in the head with a revolver. He had been ill for some time and during the absence of his nurse secured possession of the weapon, which he fired while standing in front of a looking glass.

Dunn was the inventor of an anti-friction metal compound which saved in wear and tear of railroad equipment.
