McClellan is the one striking feature to-day in the Democratic Presidential outlook, the man whose selection would mean a result of national importance.

Wants Contract Set Aside.

W. Heiden Asks for Agreement in Jersey City's Water Supply Act.

TEANECK, N. J., June 25.—William Heiden, who claims a one-quarter interest in all the profits accruing from the contract for providing Jersey City with its new water supply, filed a bill in the Court of Chancery to-day, asking that a contract between the Jersey City Water Supply Company and the New Jersey General Security Company be set aside as usurious and fraudulent.

He also asks that a receiver be appointed for all moneys paid under the contract with Congress, and that he be discharged under the court's direction.

The contract for the new water works was made between Jersey City and Patrick Flynn in 1896, the contract price being \$1,500,000.

Heiden states in the bill that the profits from the contract with Jersey City will amount to at least \$200,000, which he still claims his right to a one-quarter interest.

He declares that if Jersey City should for any reason not fulfill its contract, he would be obliged to pay the supply company for water by the million gallons and the income which would accrue would be sufficient not only to pay the interest on all outstanding bonds for the construction of the plant, but also a dividend of 20 per cent.

Heiden charges that Flynn and his associates are themselves innocent and unable to answer him on action at law on contract. He therefore asks that the court appoint a receiver to take possession of and control the profits under the contract with Jersey City in which he claims an interest.
