

SUBWAY ROW JARS BELMONT.

CANT BELIEVE McDONALD EVER SAID SUCH THINGS.

Besides, William Barclay Parsons, He says, is the Real Great Man of the Ditch—Builder Doesn't Deny His Statement—Plans for Opening Celebration.

August Belmont, who did not build the subway, was in a state of mind yesterday over the remark made on Friday by John B. McDonald, who did build the subway, that "when the dirt is off your shovel, Wall Street doesn't give a damn for you."

Mr. Belmont has been asked to speak at the celebration in the City Hall next Thursday incidental to the turning over of the West Side branch of the underground railway to the operating company. Mr. McDonald has not. Said Mr. Belmont in a written statement:

I cannot believe Mr. McDonald made any such remark as is attributed to him. It would be unworthy of him. The absurdity of such a statement is illustrated by the fact that delegations of clubs, like the Manhattan, Union and Democratic, of the Chamber of Commerce and other institutions have this week visited the subway on the joint invitation of Mr. McDonald and myself, and as I could not be present he has officiated as host on my behalf as well as his own.

But in all this nonsense about Mr. McDonald and myself, the real author of the underground system, the man from whose brain and executive supervision resulted in what is now seen as the finished subway in this city, is forgotten. William Barclay Parsons is the real man. Mr. McDonald, the subway Construction Company and the commission carried out his plan.

Neither the Interborough Company nor I have anything to do with planning the ceremonies in connection with the public opening of the subway.

It was noticed that Mr. McDonald did not issue any denial of the remark he was quoted as making in the press of yesterday. The ceremonies in the Aldermen's chamber next Thursday will not last more than an hour and a half if the programme as arranged is carried out. The Mayor will preside, and he says that he will not speak more than six minutes.

President Orr of the Rapid Transit Commission is scheduled to talk about fifteen minutes, and Chief Engineer Parsons about ten minutes. Some of the other members of the Rapid Transit Commission will make brief speeches, and President Jessup of the Chamber of Commerce will be invited to say a few words.

MORSE RECORDER ON CABLES.

Stephen Dudley Field Invents the "Amplifier," a New Telegraph Instrument.

Stephen Dudley Field has, according to the Electrical Review, invented and brought to a satisfactory practical state an important telegraphic instrument which he calls the "amplifier," and by the use of which it appears possible among other things to telegraph from Europe under the Atlantic and across the continent at one operation.

The end sought by Mr. Field was to develop an instrument which when connected to an ocean cable would enable the signals sent over the latter to be taken down by an ordinary Morse recorder.

The amplifier is in a sense a relay, but one of exceeding sensitiveness. By placing it on an artificial cable with a variable period of two seconds and using but one one-hundredth of a milliamperes, Mr. Field was able to send messages at the rate of thirty-two words a minute. These were taken down sharply by an ordinary recorder, as though the messages were coming over a short land line. The speed was limited not by the sensitiveness of the amplifier, but by the skill of the sender.

The inventor next tried it for recording wireless messages, and again it succeeded. In wireless telegraphy there are several responding devices, all of great sensitiveness. The most sensitive, says the Electrical Review, is the electrolytic, which Dr. Lee De Forest invented. It is usual to employ this responder in connection with a telephone receiver, the messages being read by ear.

Upon insertion of the amplifier in place of the telephone receiver and exposure of the responder to Hertzian waves, the amplifier at once took up the signals, setting them down by means of the usual Morse recorder without any trouble at all.

The device is of such a character, the Electrical Review says, that it can be at once applied to any telegraph system, and it is easily adjusted to obtain the best conditions. It can be used in a composite wireless and wire telegraph system, receiving wireless messages and relaying them over a land wire.

GIRLS MERCIFUL TO GIRL.

Refuse to Prosecute for Cookroom Theft and Prisoner Goes Free.

Christine Helmsstetter, the eighteen-year-old shopgirl who was locked up Friday on a charge of taking money from the coat of a fellow employee, was arraigned in Jefferson Market police court yesterday. Detective Bernard told Magistrate Mayo that the firm had decided not to press the charge against her, and that all the girls who had been losing money lately had asked that she be allowed to go free.

Magistrate Mayo discharged the prisoner. She will lose her situation, however. The girl looks younger than her years and is good looking.
