

ODELL CALLS A CONFERENCE.

WILL TAKE CHARGE NEXT WEEK OF MAYORALTY CAMPAIGN.

Few Conferees—Tim Woodruff One—Gov. Higgins to Put a Working Railroad on Railroad Board—Belmont Not Asked to Serve Again on Racing Board.

Chairman Odell of the Republican State committee sent out last night a call to some of the heads of the local Republican organization to meet him next week to talk over the Mayoralty campaign.

Mr. Woodruff's friends said last night that the alliance between himself and Chairman Odell, factually speaking, extended only until the close of the polls on election day.

Mr. Woodruff's friends do not wish him to continue to Chairman Odell any longer than is necessary, for the reason that they have just learned that Gov. Higgins refused to appoint him to a member of the Gas Commission.

Concerning the alliance between Chairman Odell's New York county organization and Mr. Woodruff's Kings county organization, Mr. Woodruff said that he was not in any way connected with the organization.

Mr. Higgins stated also that he would defer the appointment of the president of the racing commission until his return from the other side.

RECIPROCITY CONFERENCE.

Delegates Talk of a Popular Demand for Tariff Reform.

CHICAGO, Aug. 16.—Hailed by Western Governors as the proper body to determine what changes are desirable in the present tariff, the National Reciprocity Conference met to-day in the Illinois Theater.

CRASH IN QUARRY ENTOMBS 19

AVALANCHE OF ROCK CRUSHES MANY WORKMEN.

Only Three Taken Out Alive—Rescuers Work in Fear of Dynamic Which May Be Exploded at Any Minute—Cries of Injured Heard From Beneath the Rocks.

ALLENSTOWN, Pa., Aug. 16.—Twenty-two men, all of them foreigners, were buried in an avalanche of rock that slid down the side bank of the stone quarry of the Lehigh Portland Cement Company at Ormrod, seven miles north of this city to-day.

The quarry was opened five years ago by the cement company of which Col. H. C. Troxler is president, and it is now a great hole 1,200 feet long, 100 feet deep, and from 100 to 400 feet wide.

The accident occurred only five minutes before the signal was to have been given for the men to quit work for dinner, and thirty-five of them were busy sinking their picks and shovels when the ponderous avalanche of rock came sliding swiftly down the side of the bank and covered all except about a dozen of the gang.
