

HUGE WAVE HIT ADALBERT.

Smashed Doors of Women's Steerage Quarters, but Only Scared the Sleepers.

The Hamburg-American liner, Prinz Adalbert, in yesterday from Mediterranean ports, shipped a big comber over her port quarter in midocean on Saturday night, tearing out a large section of taffrail and smashing doors opening on the steerage companionway aft, where the women immigrants were quartered. The thunder of the wave awoke all hands aft.

The women became panic-stricken when the flood poured down upon them, and their screams were heard all over the ship. Officers and stewards went below and found that although many were very wet, nobody had been hurt. It took more than an hour to calm the women.

Three Italian stowaways came on the Adalbert. One of them did not show up until the ship was three days out, and he was nearly starved. Another is making his second attempt to sneak into the country. All will be sent back.


