TWO HEADS, ONE TAIL.

An Odd Little Salmon Added to the Freaks at the Aquarium.

Freaks are found among fishes just as they are among all other animals.

Some of them would seem very remarkable objects, for there are found among them Siamese twin fishes, fishes with two heads on a single body and fishes with a single head and two tails.

Of a lot of 10,000 hump backed salmon eggs lately hatched at the Aquarium there appeared about a dozen little freak fishes of one sort and another, of which all but three or four had already succumbed.

Of the survivors, which are now about two and a half months old, the most remarkable is a little salmon about an inch and a half long which has two heads and two forward bodies projecting at an angle from a single body, which single, regular body constitutes about two-thirds of the total weight of the fish.

This little two headed salmon is now lively and feeding well, its two heads appearing to act independently in feeding.

When the food for the little fishes, which consists of chopped up herring roe, is put into the hatching trough, one head of the two-headed salmon will pull one way, the other head will pull the other, the result of course they can't pull very far apart.

The two-headed salmon would become a great curiosity if it could be reared, but four months is about as long as such freak fishes have been known to live.
