FAST TRIP FOR LA PROVENCE. Mrs. William Astor returns—John B. McDonald a Passenger. The steamship La Provence arrived yesterday afternoon with many returning tourists. She made the passage in 6 days 8 hours, which is not far behind her record. On board were 513 cabin and 822 stowage passengers. Among the saloon passengers were Galery C. Morse, Eleanor Robinson, the actress, and her mother, Mrs. Madge Carr Cook; Mr. H. E. Farrer, W. Gordon Kellogg, Starr Miller, the Vicomtesse de la Bassolles and J. Baker Bonner. Mrs. William Astor occupied a suite of rooms on the promenade deck and said that she had had a delightful passage. She said she intended to go to her town house, and possibly to-day, if she felt well enough and thoroughly rested, she would go to Newport. She was met at the pier by servants and driven to her home at once. J. B. McDonald said he had been away for a few weeks on a pleasure trip. He was told of the efforts to improve the ventilation of the subway and said he understood that the ventilation was much better now. "The ventilation problem will soon be worked out satisfactorily I am sure," he said. When asked how it was that the Boston subway was so much better ventilated he replied: "They do not have to carry so many passengers in Boston and consequently there is less vitality taken out of the air."
