

ENTRIES FOR PALM BEACH.

Three Power Boats From Halifax Will Be Among the Competitors.

Theodore D. Wells, chairman of the regatta committee of the Palm Beach Power Boat Association, has announced the list of entries for the races that are to be held on Lake Worth beginning January 29. Among those that will compete are three from the Halifax Yacht Club, so the carnival will be an international one.

The American Power Boat Association rules will govern and each day the racing will begin in the morning and be finished late in the afternoon. The schedule is as follows:
Tuesday, January 29—Class A, 5 miles, 11 A. M.; class B, 10 miles, 11:30 A. M.; class C, 10 miles, 2:30 P. M.; class D, 10 miles, 3:30 P. M.
Wednesday, January 30—Class A or class X, 5 miles, 11 A. M.; class B or class Y, 10 miles, 11:30 A. M.; class C or class Z, 10 miles, 2:30 P. M.; class D or class W, 10 miles, 3:30 P. M.
Thursday, January 31—Class X, 5 miles, 10:30 A. M.; class Y, 5 miles, 11 A. M.; class Z, 5 miles, 11:30 A. M.; class W, 5 miles, 2:30 P. M.; class V, 5 miles, 3 P. M.
Friday, February 1—Six trials, one mile events.
10:30 A. M., consolation, 5 miles, 2 P. M., closing event, endurance run, 3 P. M.

The classification is as follows: Class A, rating 30 feet and below; class B, rating 25 feet and above; class C, all boats; class X, 25 feet and under load water line; class Y, 25 feet and above load water line; class Z, all English load water line.

COLUMBIA FENCING SCHEDULE.

Capt. Sage Will Lead Blue and White Team in Season's Campaign.
The schedule of the Columbia fencing team, which was announced yesterday, is as follows:
February 14, West Point at West Point; 25, Annapolis at Annapolis; March 1, triangular meet between Yale, Princeton and Columbia at New York;


at Cornell at New York; 18, Princeton at Princeton; 29 and 30, Intercollegiate fencing tournament at the New York Athletic Club.
A quadrangular meet between Harvard, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Yale and Columbia is also being arranged, and will probably take place in Boston on March 2. Some time during the season the team will also meet the New York Athletic Club, the Fencers' Club, the New York Turn Verein and the Brooklyn Fencers' Club.
The team has suffered a loss this year in O. D. Kehrlin, who did the best work in the intercollegiate meet last season. Captain Sage, however, is in better form than he was a year ago, and may be expected to fence as well as he did two years ago, when he won the individual championship. Other men of last year's team who are back are C. G. Amend and R. M. Miller.

Middles Will Meet Indians in Track Events.
ANNAPOLIS, Md., Jan. 13.—The management of the Naval Academy and Carlisle Indian field and track teams have fixed upon May 11 as the date of the dual meet to take place at Annapolis between the representatives of the two institutions. Monte Fleasak, Libbey, Exendine and Jude are members of the Carlisle football team who are also field and track men, while the navy is putting special reliance in Carey, who has done the 100 yards in 9 4/5 seconds. The institutions have never met in this line of sport.


