

HEAVY BLAST INJURES MANY AND DAMAGES BUILDINGS FOR THREE BLOCKS AROUND.

One of the Victims of the Rock Shower is Likely to Die and Several Are Severely Hurt—Accident Was in Pennsylvania Excavation—Caused by Old Blast.

Fourteen persons were hurt, one of them perhaps mortally, by a shower of rocks from a blast yesterday in the excavation for the Pennsylvania terminal on the west side of Seventh avenue near Thirty-third street. The whole neighborhood was shaken by the force of the explosion and rocks and small stones damaged buildings and smashed windows within an area of three blocks. One rock weighing over 100 pounds ripped through the north wall of the clothing store of Finesilver & Klosty at 305 Seventh avenue, scattering bricks and mortar on every side and smashed a foot deep hole in the opposite wall of the store. Mrs. Isaac Finesilver and her four children with her sister Mrs. Leah Klosty and her baby had just passed through the store on their way to their lunch in the rear room. The rock on the rebound from the wall struck the partition behind which the families were dining. The building was wrecked. The rock in its passage tore a hole four feet in diameter and wrecked practically all the windows in the house upstairs. Mrs. Amelia Dorr fainted from the shock. Another rock sailed south over the building on Thirty-first street and descending crashed through the plate glass window of Nelson's saloon at the southwest corner of Thirtieth street and Seventh avenue. In its flight it had crossed the five story building on the opposite side of the street. No one in the saloon was hurt.

The remarkable feature of the explosion is the fact that so few people were hurt. The hour was so close to noon that Seventh avenue was crowded with sightseers who were watching the blasting. The traffic also was heavy. Only one of the workmen, Virgilio Nigheseo, a flagman, was hurt. The reserves from the West Thirtieth street station were charged immediately after the accident. Ambulances arrived from Bellevue, New York, Hudson street, and Roosevelt hospitals. Inspector Joseph Burns and Deputy Commissioner Hughes directed the police work. The injured were:

Frank Ordivese, 35 years old, 325 East Twenty-fifth street, taken to New York Hospital. Henry Bell, 50 years old, Ramblersville, Pa., left arm broken, hurt about the head; New York Hospital. Lucy Johnson, 24 years old, 142 West Thirty-second street, lacerated wound on left leg; New York Hospital. Alexander Padrone, 42 years old, 129 West Twenty-sixth street, abrasions of head and face; taken home.

Frank Bonacore, 34 years old, 375 Seventh avenue, lacerations of head and body; Hudson street hospital.

Frank Weber, 12 years old, 305 Seventh avenue, contusions of left knee; taken home.

Ernest Dirkes, 18 years old, 160 East 102d street, body bruises; taken home.

Frank Schultz, 12 years old, 305 Seventh avenue, right leg lacerated; taken home.

John Ryan, 28 years old, 165 Seventh avenue, broken ribs and internal injuries; Bellevue Hospital.

Stavros Melonas, 24 years old, 165 West Thirty-first street, hit in back by rock while hanging clothes on roof; attended at home.

Virgilio Nigheseo, 36 years old, 423 East Twenty-second street, fracture of thigh; Bellevue Hospital.

Frank Ordivese, 35 years old, 335 East Thirty-eighth street, right arm broken and internal injuries.

Amelia Dorr, 59 years old, 305 Seventh avenue, shock; attended at home.

Hugo Canepa, 8 years old, 145 West Twenty-seventh street, fracture of base of skull; taken to French Hospital and not expected to live.

Immediately after the accident John Fitzpatrick, superintendent of excavation, was placed under arrest. John Tobin, who is said to have had charge of the blast that caused the explosion, disappeared after the accident.

Managing Engineer Collins of the New York Contracting Company, which has charge of the excavation work, said last night that the violence of the explosion was "due to the explosion of a charge of dynamite which was put into the rock for a former blast but failed to explode then."

BORN COLLECTION BEGUN

With Dr. Hornaday's Gift as a Starter—To Be Kept at the Bronx Zoo.

News of interest to sportsmen and scientists is that the national collection of heads and horns, long in existence as a project, is to become an institution and a fact, with Dr. William T. Hornaday's private collection donated as a nucleus.

Those who have furthered the scheme with Dr. Hornaday, who represents the Camp Fire Club in the proposition, are Madison Grant, secretary of the New York Zoological Society, acting for the Boer and Crockett Club, and John M. Phillips, Pennsylvania State Game Commissioner, in behalf of the Lewis and Clark Club. A committee on acceptances will be formed to pass judgment on subsequent gifts to the collection and to purchase other specimens as needed. Sportsmen may present testimonials of their personal skill, providing these pass the committee test, or they may authorize the committee to buy desirable specimens as they appear in the market.

The New York Zoological Society will own the collection and will take care of it. For a time it will be housed in the administration building of the society, which is now being built in Bronx Park.

The nucleus collection contains 122 specimens, including 100 species of big game animals, representing the five great divisions of the horned race—the deer, bison, antelope, sheep and goat families. A pair of elephant tusks is another feature, and perhaps the champion one. It is the record set of elephant tusks in the world, over eleven feet in length, a foot and a half in base circumference and 295 pounds in combined weight. They were presented by the New York Zoological Society by Charles T. Barney and were formerly the property of Menelek, King of Abyssinia.

Other prize features are a pair of horns from the great Siberian Argali, biggest of mountain sheep in the world, and a pair of the side of which those of our native Rocky Mountain big horn look insignificant. The big horn himself is represented by a superb head, magnificently mounted. There are deer and moose antlers in striking array.

A feature that is said to be impossible to duplicate is a set of twelve pairs of American bison horns gathered from wild sources, showing twelve stages in the growth of the animal from a yearling to a stub horn of twenty years.

The collection contains some interesting examples of antelope horns, from the fifty inch branches of the greater kudu—horns unusual anywhere for their great beauty—to the two and a quarter inch projections of the toy duiker. Of the 138 species of antelope thirty five varieties are represented in the collection.
