Four favorites and a second choice rewarded the form players at Brighton Beach yesterday.

Running Water, the two-year-old, five and a half furlongs, Sim Deimel's Gene Russell was a hot favorite, backed down to 7 to 10.

Bellwether was two lengths in front of Cornock, a 25 to 1 shot. Boots Durnell's Joe Newman, 3 to 1, was a close runner, never a factor, E. Dugan being received with hisses from the crowd when he came back to the scales.

The Newcastle Stable's Running Water, 2 to 1 favorite, ran off the hand-drawn mares at a mile and a sixteenth.

Miller, who rode her, let Zienap, 6 to 1, and Ruby, 7 to 1, set the pace to the far turn, where Running Water went to the outside and breezed home with lengths to the good ones.

1:48-1/2. Zienap lasted long enough to take the place by a neck from Sonoma Belle, 12 to 1. Ruby was eased up at the head of the stretch.
