THE MAYOR'S PLAN FOR THE CHARTER REVISION.

He would also submit the Borough Presidents and the Board of Estimate a specially drafted Bill—Provisional Charter, to be passed by the Board of Estimate.

The Mayor is a member of the Charter Revision Committee, whose members thus far have been secret.

First: That the revised charter should be as simple as possible and that the mass of minor provisions contained in the present charter should be eliminated.

Second: That the office of Borough President should be abolished and that the responsibility for all the executive branches of the city government should be centered upon the Mayor.

Third: That the number of city departments should be reduced by consolidating those which now possess more or less similar functions.

Fourth: That the Board of Estimate and Apportionment should be composed of city officials, but of members elected directly for this purpose.

Fifth: That the Mayor should be empowered to make a new charter upon the simplest lines. The briefer its provisions the more effective, in his judgment, it will prove to be.

The Mayor says he recognizes the difficulty of obtaining such an absolute grant of power from the Legislature, but that he believes efforts should be directed along that line, and that in any event the charter can and should be reduced in size.

The Borough Presidents are amenable to no superior in the city government and can be removed by the Governor only.

The "inefficiency of such a system," he says, "has been thoroughly demonstrated during the last two years.

The powers and duties of a Borough President are so little understood by the public that he escapes the responsibility which belongs to him.

The matter of reducing the number of departments the Mayor's plan is to have a few larger departments in place of a lot of smaller departments.

Street administration is now vested in the Police Department, the Department of Street Cleaning, the Department of Water Supply, Gas and Electricity and the various bureaus under the Borough President.

The hospitals are administered under three independent departments, the Health Department, the Department of Public Charities and the trustees of Bellevue and Allied Hospitals.

The work of the Board of Estimate has grown so that it will soon be impossible for the Mayor, the Comptroller or the other members to give the proper time to this work.

Upon further consideration," he goes on to say, "I think that some plan, which you mentioned at a recent meeting of the commission, namely, that of reducing the size of the board and electing a portion of its members by the vote of the people, is probably the wisest.
