BORUSSIA SINKS AT LISBON. Vessel Swamped While Coaling—All the Passengers Safe. LONDON, Oct. 23.—A despatch to Lloyd's from Lisbon states that the Hamburg-American Steamship Company's liner Borussia, on its way from Brazil for Hamburg, foundered last night while coaling. A strong tide-way caused the ship to list and the water rushed into its coaling ports.

LITHUANIA HARD AGROUND. Will Take Eight Days to Float Her—New Steamer for Passengers. LONDON, Oct. 23.—The Russian Asiatic Company's steamship Lithuania, which was ashore yesterday at Skillingen, on the Swedish coast, in a fog, with 600 passengers bound from Libau to New York, is not expected to be refloated in less than eight days. The company is arranging to forward the passengers to their destination by another steamer.

HYDROPLANE GOES 300 YARDS. Santos-Dumont's Machine Still Far From Winning Him \$10,000. PARIS, Oct. 23.—Santos-Dumont made the second experiment with his hydroplane or sliding boat today. It was only slightly more successful than the first.

EARTHQUAKE IN CALABRIA. Severe Shocks in the South of Italy Destroy Many Villages. PARIS, Oct. 24.—A despatch to the Matin from Turin states that a severe earthquake has occurred throughout Calabria and that many villages have been destroyed.
