RURAL DELIVERY SERVICE

37,728 ROUTES IN OPERATION ON JUNE 30 LAST.

Served by 37,882 Carriers—\$48,193,218 Required to Pay the Carriers for the Current Fiscal Year—The Past Business of the Dead Letter Office.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 5.—The annual report of Fourth Assistant Postmaster-General De Gray deals chiefly with the rural free delivery service. It says that extension of the service has continued during the last fiscal year, but there has been a marked decline in the requests for new service, thus indicating that the appropriations made by the Congress for the development of rural delivery have fully quelled the demand.

At the close of the fiscal year 1907 rural delivery was in operation on 37,728 routes served by 37,882 carriers. On 899 of these routes service is performed only once a week, 2,133 as compared with the number filed during the preceding year. Of the petitions filed 1,804 were accepted for investigation. Of the 348 routes discontinued during the fiscal year, 107 were discontinued because of the failure of patrons to pay for the service. Incident to the inspection of existing rural service and the establishment of additional rural routes, 3,078 petitions have been received, and their patrons are being served by rural carriers.

In cases where, in the establishment of rural service, it was necessary to cover roads traversed by carriers on star routes or mail routes, and where the mail routes were discontinued, it has been frequently possible to curtail or discontinue the star route or messenger service, and where necessary, to transfer post offices involved transported by rural carriers without additional expense.

Of the operations of the Dead Letter Bureau the report states that 1,512,465 more pieces of mail matter were restored to owners than during the preceding year. The number delivered, 5,225,792, constitutes about 50 per cent. of enclosures sent to the division for disposal.

The statistics compiled for the year show in detail the receipt of 13,065,255 letters and 1,011,200 parcels, and the disposition of value other than correspondence. Of this number 1,354,896 were posted in foreign countries, and 76,724 enclosed negotiable paper.
