FAREWELLS TO ROYAL DEAD

MOTHER AND WIDOW OF CARLOS OVERCOME WITH GRIEF.

Remains Transferred to Palace Chapel - Portuguese King Died a Poor Man - Premier Ferreira Awaits Developments - Franco Appeals to History.

Special Cable Despatches to THE SUN. LISBON, Feb. 7.—The remains of the late King and Crown Prince were placed in coffins last night. Before this was done Queen Amelia, King Manuel and the lower Queen Maria Pia bade farewell to their dead.

The remains were transferred to the chapel at midnight. The coffin containing the King's body was of immense weight and was carried by twenty-five grooms.

All the Republican and other politicians who were arrested in the excitement following the assassination on suspicion of being involved in a plot against the lives of the King and Crown Prince, including three who were believed to have been actually engaged in the attack, have been released.

The Diario says that King Carlos possessed little beyond his insurance policies, which were used as security for certain advances from the Bank of Portugal.

When these advances shall have been repaid there will remain about \$30,000. The Epoca says that King Carlos, in saying good-bye to one of the officers at Villa Vicoso on Saturday, said: "I embrace you for the last time."

A revolver was found in the royal carriage after the murder of the King, which he had evidently attempted to use in defending himself.

30 AT REPUBLICAN CAUCUS.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7.—Exactly thirty Republicans put in an appearance to-night at the party caucus, which was held for the purpose of selecting members of the Republican Congressional campaign committee.

The caucus was in session thirty minutes. It confirmed about fifteen selections of members by State delegations and authorized that an order be entered that the State delegations be notified.
