WILL BE NO TOBACCO RAISED.

Night Riders Seem to Have Kentucky Planters Terrified. LEXINGTON, Ky., March 10.—A prominent tobacco man said to-night that he did not believe a pound of tobacco would be grown in central Kentucky this season.

George L. Grady, whose barn was burned by night riders Friday night, says he will grow a crop if he is to hire men to stand guard over it until it is sent to market, but since this would be a difficult undertaking it is believed that he like the others will give in to the ultimatum laid down by the Equity Society that no tobacco shall be grown this year.

The large rewards offered for night riders has so far tempted no one. It is not likely that if the price on the roads of Kentucky riders was ten times \$1,000 the amount would effect the capture of a single man.

The band that burned barns Friday night came from Franklin county. There they were seen by several persons and Gov. Wilson saw the flaming barns from a car window as he returned to Frankfort from a banquet here.

March 10 more, title of Richard M. Squires, pointed last week, died last night. Squires has announced that he will not raise tobacco. Jasper Offutt of Bourbon county declares that he will raise tobacco, but as so far the only one to do so.

BENJAMIN DEVALI HELD.

Servant Who Accused Him After Wife's Death Had Demanded Money, Lawyer Says. Benjamin Devali of Woodliff, N. J., who was arrested Saturday night in his room at 252 West Fourteenth street, Manhattan, on suspicion of having killed his wife, was arraigned yesterday by Central Office Detectives Griffin and Brown in the Jefferson Market court.

The detective told Magistrate Corrigan that a warrant had been issued in Jersey for the arrest of Devali. This warrant, they said, was based upon information given to the Jersey police by Mary Flynn, who was a servant in Devali's house up to the time of Mrs. Devali's death.

Devali was accompanied by a lawyer, who said that Miss Flynn was discharged by Devali after his wife's death. Later this woman came to Devali, the lawyer said, and demanded money. Devali had paid her her wages and she refused to give any more. This angered Miss Flynn, said the lawyer, and she went to the police and made a charge that Mrs. Devali did not commit suicide, as was supposed and reported by the coroner, but was killed by her lover.

"If this woman accuses my client of any crime," added the lawyer, "I demand that she be produced as a complainant." The police replied that the woman was in Jersey.

"Then I want to know what right the police had to let her go to Jersey after she made such a complaint," demanded the lawyer. Magistrate Corrigan asked why this had been allowed.

"She went back with the police chief of Woodliff," said the lawyer, "to swear out a warrant. I have just had word over the telephone saying that a policeman is now on his way from Jersey with that warrant."

Then a small hold the defendant for the office of Jersey, said the court. Devali was locked up without bail and will be arraigned to-day.

KELAHER NOT MURDERED.

The Bones Found in the Ruins of His Home Were Those of Some Animal. MIDDLETOWN, N. Y., March 10.—The general belief that Daniel Kelaher, a well-to-do farmer of Montgomery, Orange county, was murdered and that his body was burned to ashes in the destruction of his home Thursday night was changed to-day after a thorough examination of the bones that were found in the ruins of the burned house.

Dr. Hardenbergh is positive that the bones are not human bones, but rather those of a large animal, presumably a cow, and accounts for their presence in the ruins by saying that they are seen bones as a result of being under a porch. The finding of the bones was the only evidence found that a person had been in the building.

Coroner Crist now says that in all probability he will hold no inquest unless he finds positive evidence that there was a human body in the ruins. The coroner has abandoned the murder theory and is now bending his energies to finding Daniel Kelaher alive. Kelaher was last taken a position at the Livingston State Hospital Saturday and is being sought in that city. Because there had been false feelings between Daniel Kelaher and his brother Michael, Kelaher was believed to have something about the burning of his brother's house, but there has been a reaction and the neighbors now exonerate Michael. Mrs. Helen Kelaher, a sister of the missing man, yesterday told a friend that a short time ago Daniel had said to her:

"Helen, if my house should burn up, if I'm gone they would think Mike did it. I don't want to be a suspect. I don't want anything of the kind at the time. The police are looking for me. I don't want any effort to find the missing man will be continued by the authorities."

RESIST NAZI SENTENCE.

Some New York Italians Send a Protest to Rome. M. A. Mercurio, a Sicilian banker here, presided in Webster Hall yesterday at a meeting of 400 Italians held to protest against the imprisonment of Nunzio Nasi, former Secretary of Education of Italy, for misappropriation of the public funds. Pasquale Pati, the Italian banker who shot and killed a supposed member of the Black Hand a few days ago, was to have been chairman, but did not appear.

Nasi is a Sicilian and his sentence has been followed by riots in Sicily. Some of the speakers yesterday charged that the prosecution of Nasi was caused by sectional prejudice, that other Ministers have used the money in their possession to buy political friends and that if Nasi had been anybody but a Sicilian his indictment would have been overlooked. Resolutions were adopted laying Nasi's conviction and sentence to personal hatred, sectional prejudice and political passion, and a message of protest was ordered sent to the Italian Government.

A woman jumped up in the audience and shouted, "Down with the monarchy!" which was answered by hurrah for the Republic. The minister did not think anything of the remark at the time. The woman was taken to the hospital.

"May a voice of protest, sympathy and hope reach you, who have fought for the common faith and for the sorrowing women of your home from the Italians of America."
