

BISHOP POTTER DEAD AT 74

HIS LONG ILLNESS AT COOPERSTOWN ENDS.

Head of New York Diocese since 1886 and a prominent figure in the city's life...

COOPERSTOWN, N. Y., July 21.—The death of the Right Rev. Henry Codrington Potter...

Bishop Potter passed very peacefully away at 8:30 P. M. His strength gradually failed during the past twenty-four hours...

At the death he was Mrs. Henry C. Potter, two daughters of the bishop, Mrs. C. S. Davidge of San Francisco...

The turn for the worse in Bishop Potter's condition came yesterday morning, following a week of encouragement to the family and physicians...

Bishop Potter arrived in Cooperstown with Mrs. Potter on June 6. The bishop was able to attend to his affairs, going daily to his office in the Clark Estates building...

The bishop's courage, his great cheerfulness and vitality made his recovery seem made by physicians. He gained strength gradually and it was hoped that his life might be spared...

In the twenty-four hours of Monday the bishop experienced considerable pain, the first during his illness. This was checked by night and the physician reported this morning that the patient had rested well during the night and that the pain had been alleviated...

The pain did not return, but he gradually lost strength until the end. The bishop was unconscious practically the entire day, and that condition died.

No funeral arrangements had been made at 11 o'clock to-night. It is probable, however, that the body will then be taken to New York for services.

Bishop Potter had been Bishop of New York since 1886. He was elected assistant bishop in 1888. His uncle, the late Rev. Henry H. Potter, bishop of New York...

Bishop Potter was born in Schenectady, N. Y., May 25, 1834. His father, the Rev. Dr. Alonzo Potter, was vice-president of Union College. The bishop was educated at Philadelphia and in Virginia...
