

METROPOLITAN'S FIRST WEEK

PROGRAMME FOR THE OPENING OF THE OPERA SEASON.

"Aida" at the First Performance With Toscanini in the Conductor's Chair—New Singers Soon to Be Heard—List of the Season's Boxholders.

The repertoire for the first week of the season at the Metropolitan Opera House was announced yesterday. Arturo Toscanini will conduct "Aida" on the opening night with a cast that includes Misses Destinn, Homer and Sparkes and MM. Caruso, Didur, Amato and Rossi. The opera will be presented with the new scenery and costumes from the ateliers of the artists of La Scala in Milan.

"Die Walkure" on Wednesday will introduce Erik Schmedes, the new German tenor from Vienna; Fritz Feinhals and Allen Hückley. Mmes. Gadski, Fremstad and Homer will have the other roles. Alfred Hertz will conduct. On Thursday "Madama Butterfly" will be sung by Mmes. Farrar and Fornia and MM. Caruso and Amato.

Mme. Semblich, and MM. Bonci and Amato will appear on Friday in "La Traviata" and Francesco Spertino, the new Italian conductor, will make his debut. As the Saturday matinee Mmes. Eames and MM. Caruso and Scotti will sing "Tosca," which is to be conducted by Signor Spertino. Mmes. Farrar and L'Hullier and MM. Quarta, a new tenor; Campanari, Didur and Bossi will sing "La Boheme" on Saturday evening at the first popular priced performance.

Preliminary to the opening of the New York season will be the performance of "Faust" at the Brooklyn Academy of Music next Saturday. Mmes. Farrar, L'Hullier and Matfield and MM. Caruso, Didur, Noté and Ananian will appear.

BOY FROZEN TO DEATH.

His Body Found Covered With Snow in Roscoe Conkling Park, Utica. UTICA, Nov. 7.—With a bed of leaves beneath him and a coverlet of snow the body of Michael Fileto, a schoolboy, was found to-day in Roscoe Conkling Park, in the southern part of this city. The lad, who was 15 years old, was frozen stiff, and as far as appearances would indicate had died of exposure. The authorities, however, believe there is a possibility that the lad was a victim of foul play and are proceeding on the theory that a bruise on his head may have had something to do with his death. The boy could hardly have lost his way, for there were several houses within a few hundred feet, and at night the lights of the city gleam bright in the valley below.
