COLORADO LED IN OUTPUT; ALASKA A GOOD SECOND.

Figures of the Director of the Mint and Seattle Assay Office—New Developments in Lake Superior Copper—Black Hills Promises—Mine News.

SEATTLE, Feb. 13.—Alaska stood second in the list of States and Territories in the production of gold in the United States for the year 1908, according to a preliminary estimate made by Frank A. Leach, Director of the Mint, producing over one-fifth of the nation's total. Colorado came runner-up ahead of Alaska as a gold producer. Of a total yield in the United States of \$96,313,900 Alaska produced \$20,830,784.

The total gold production of the world is estimated by the Mining and Scientific Press at \$47,000,000, an increase of \$17,500,000, due mainly to the output of South Africa, which the preliminary estimate gives a production of \$14,675,000. The United States holds second place in the world with an increase for the year of \$5,878,200.
