FRENCH PEDS TAKE THE LEAD

THEY PASS BOSTONIANS IN THE SIX DAY RACE.

Hard Fight Between the Leaders in Madison Square Garden—Seventeen Teams Left in and Many Are Foot-sore and Weary—New Combinations.

At the end of the first twenty-four hours of the six day race in Madison Square Garden last night seventeen teams were left out of the twenty-seven that started, and they plodded along footsore and weary.

The last hour was marked by a hard fight between the Boston and French teams for the lead and at 12 o'clock this morning the foreigners deprived Dineen and Prouty of first place.

For three hours or more the Frenchmen were gradually crawling toward the front. The New York team—Spring and Adams—had fallen to last place.

At 11:30 o'clock Dineen and Prouty equalled the old record for twenty-four hours, which was 183 miles.

After the first hour which was at 1 o'clock yesterday morning, Dineen and Prouty were about a mile ahead of the record made by Hegelman and Cavanaugh in 1927.
