

THE DEATH OF LIEUT. SUTTON

REINVESTIGATION ORDERED BY THE NAVY DEPARTMENT. The Reasons for Reopening the Case Are That an Officer Has Been Accused of Murdering Sutton and the Evidence at the First Inquiry Was Incomplete.

WASHINGTON, July 9.—Bookman Winthrop Amiel, Secretary of the Navy, gave out an official statement today explaining the reasons for the reopening of the investigation into the death of Lieut. James N. Sutton of the Marine Corps, who died as a result of a wound in the head caused by a pistol shot on October 13, 1907. The principal reason for the re-investigation, the statement said, was that an officer of the Marine Corps had been accused of murdering Sutton.

At the time of his death Lieut. Sutton was a student at the marine school of application, where newly appointed marine officers receive their preliminary training. According to the testimony given at the first investigation Sutton was quarrelled with by another officer as they accompanied by several other officers, were returning in an automobile from a dance at Annapolis to the barracks. There was a fist fight after the party left the automobile in which Sutton is said to have been vanquished. The testimony tended to show that he went to his quarters and obtained a revolver with the intention of shooting his antagonist.

EARL OF RIPON DEAD.

George Frederick Samuel Robinson, Marquis of Ripon, was born in London on October 24, 1827. The title of Earl of Ripon dates in his family from 1853 and he was created the first Marquis in 1871. He was the son of the first Earl of Ripon and Sarah, the only daughter of the fourth Earl of Buckinghamshire. He married Henrietta Anne Theodosia, the daughter of Capt. Henry Vyner, in 1851.


