DRIVERS EXPECT NEW 24 HOUR RECORD AT BRIGHTON BEACH.

Motorcar race in fine condition for last race of season—Entrants get additional drivers—Lewis driving to be one of the fastest pilots.

Many of the drivers who are to pilot cars entered in the last twenty-four hour race of the season, which starts at 4 o'clock to-day at the Brighton Beach Motorodrome, have declared their intention of making every effort to better the present record of 1,177 miles, made last fall by George Robertson and Frank Leacock with a Simplex.

The title contest in the motor track is in a good condition as it is possible to put a dirt surfaced track. The track has been rolled and scraped repeatedly and has been sprinkled many times with glutin to prevent the dust from getting in the tires of the competing drivers during the race.

The officers of the Automobile Club of Philadelphia have completed the preliminary arrangements for holding the seventh annual contest for the Brazier cup to be run on the 24-hour track at Brighton Beach on the 21st and 22nd inst.

The founder members of "The Cardinals," an organization which came into being when the club was organized in 1897, are interested in the contest.

Word comes from Chicago that the automobile owners and drivers of the Western metropolis are already showing great interest in this year's race for the Vanderbilt.
