

J. H. SMITH HOME AT AUCTION

HOUSE AND TREASURES WHICH STANFORD WHITE GATHERED.

America's Most Notable Sale of the Sort to Take Place in January—Building, to Be Put Up First, Worth \$1,000,000 and the Art Collection Much More.

The coming season of auction sales of art works is to be marked by what probably will prove the biggest auction of the kind measured in money values ever held in this country.

Probably 2,000 catalogue numbers will be required. It is likely that the sale will require at least a week.

This most imposing house, at the northeast corner of Fifth avenue and sixty-eighth street, is in its interior one of the most splendid in America.

The Smith house is in marked contrast to the Henry W. Poor house, another of Mr. White's works, which was sold last season.

The house, which formerly belonged to the late Robert L. Stuart, was remodelled and extended by the late William C. Whitney, who was the intermediate owner between Mr. Stuart and Mr. Smith.

The house and ground, judging from the appraisal of neighboring real estate, are estimated to be worth about \$1,000,000 and \$3,000,000 in the embellishment.

FURRIERS GUILTY OF FRAUD.

Also a Lawyer Who Helped Smother Assets Before "Bankruptcy."

A verdict of guilty against Herman Feinberg, senior member of the firm of H. Feinberg & Son, furriers, of 48 East Tenth street; his son-in-law, Abraham Minsky; Samuel Medlin, a furrier, of 15 East Eighteenth street, and Matthias Radin, a lawyer, of 320 Broadway, was brought in last night by a jury in the criminal branch of the United States Circuit Court.

The convicted men were indicted last May by the Federal Grand Jury. The indictment says that the firm found itself in financial straits on October 29, 1908, and that on that day a family council was called to discuss the situation.

It is charged that the day before this consultation took place there was a full stock of furs in the store at 48 East Tenth street. Two days later, it is charged, a set of furs was surreptitiously shipped to Montreal, Canada, and a substantial part of the balance of the stock put in a store next door at 46 East Tenth street, where a business was opened under the name of the Bell Fur Co.

The receiver took charge of the Feinberg store he found goods to the value of only \$500.

Feinberg & Son are fur dealers of international repute. The firm has branch houses in Leipzig and London. It is understood that the largest losers among the creditors are in Leipzig.
