Gov. Fort's Requisition Sent to Gov. Hughes—Prisoners Won't Resist. Detective Sergeant Walter Godfrey of the staff of Prosecutor Mott of Essex county, New Jersey, left Newark last night for Albany, where he will ask Gov. Hughes to sign the requisition papers for the extradition to New Jersey of Mrs. Caroline B. Martin and her sister, Mrs. Mary W. Snead, who are under arrest in the Tombs in connection with the death of Mrs. Okey Snead in East Orange on November 29.

MRS. DRUMMOND GETS DIVORCE.

Father Testifies That He Has Supported Her Since Her Marriage. ST. LOUIS, Dec. 28.—Mrs. Maud Ringen Drummond, daughter of John Ringen, a stove manufacturer, got a divorce from Charles R. Drummond, one of the heirs of the late John T. Drummond, the tobacco manufacturer, this afternoon. She gets custody of their three children. Alimony was not mentioned.

MOTHER'S RING ALL HE HAD.

Penniless Frenchman Found Dead of Gas Asphyxiation. Eugene Rainville, 40 years old, a Frenchman, who was employed as a salesman in Manhattan, was found dead yesterday morning from gas asphyxiation in his furnished room at 57 Myrtle avenue, Brooklyn.

Yeting Residence on the Bottom Step.

Owen J. O'Neil was on trial before Justice Found in the Criminal Branch of the Supreme Court yesterday, charged with voting illegally on election day. O'Neil gave his address as 223 East Fifty-eighth street, but no one by the name of O'Neil was known at that address. O'Neil explained to Justice Found yesterday that he had given the wrong number; that he really lived at 221 and not 223.

Special Panel for Coker's Libel Suit.

A special panel of seventy-five prominent Brooklynites has been drawn from which to select the jury for the second trial of the suit of President of the Borough Board S. Coker against the Brooklyn Eagle for \$10,000 damages for alleged libel. The trial will begin on Monday, two days after Mr. Coker retires from office, before Justice Maddox in the Supreme Court. There was a disagreement of the jury in the first trial, which lasted nearly a month, the majority being with the plaintiff.

Plymouth Church to Sell Property.

Justice Blackman in the Supreme Court in Brooklyn yesterday gave permission to Plymouth Church to sell its property at Pearl and Tillary streets, long the home of the Mayflower Mission, for \$14,750. A new site for the mission is to be secured.

Y. M. C. A. Craps Game Raided.

A lively game of craps in which a number of bluejackets were engaged at the naval branch of the Y. M. C. A. in Sands street, Brooklyn, was broken up early yesterday morning by a cop from the Fulton street station, who had been summoned by the night manager of the branch. All the players made a quick bolt from the room with the exception of two, who stopped to pick up the change, and they were arrested and taken to the station. They were very penitent when arraigned yesterday before Magistrate Dooley in the Adams street court and they got off with a reprimand.
