QUARTZ MINING AT VALDEZ

360 OUNCES OF GOLD TAKEN FROM 150 TONS OF ORE.

54,000 in Concentrates Also Secured in 18 Days Trial-Deals in British Columbia Mine Properties—Senator Clark's Sale to the Amalgamated.

SEATTLE, May 16.—A despatch from Valdez yesterday says: "The first attempt at quartz mining in this district has proved highly successful. Returns received here today from the first eighteen days' operations of the Cliff Mining Company's claim showed an output of 300 ounces of gold, besides 54,000 in concentrates, from 150 tons of ore. The company was organized eight months ago to develop the quartz vein on Valdez Bay, and a thousand-foot tunnel and an uprise was driven, and a three-stamp mill installed."

Joseph Higson and associates have given a bond on 2500 acres of placer ground along the line of the Alaska Northern Railroad at Mile 24, Fair Creek, to Victoria investors, represented by T. Ford Hopkins.

The Alaska Hydraulic & Hydraulic Company has bonded the Cappell and Burr placer property, consisting of twenty-eight 160 acre claims, in the Fair Creek district, and will spend \$5,000,000 in development work this season.

BRITISH COLUMBIA. SEATTLE, May 16.—Two important mining deals consummated today. The first is the sale of the Mollie Gibson to the Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company, and the second is the sale of the Boundary and Kootenai mines to the Boundary and Kootenai Smelting and Refining Company.

The second big deal transfers the Emulator, Ella, Prima Donna, Iola, Nelson and Kootenai mines, claims to Albert Heyman, W. B. Arnold, J. A. Conkey, William D. Hayward and Edward Southernland of Vancouver. The former owners, Michael Monahan and James McKiernan of Nelson, accepted \$50,000 cash and one-fourth interest in the new company, which will be formed for exploitation of the mines.

The claims are undeveloped properties adjoining the Echo-Surfer, Elsie and Alice group of twenty-one claims, mostly developed. A large force of men will be put to work at once.

The Contact group of eight claims at Tasso Harbor, the new copper gold camp on the west coast of Moresby Island, has been bonded for \$100,000 by Hugh Cannon of Grand Forks, who is understood to represent the Butte mining interests. Mr. Cannon left Vancouver this week for the property. Development work on a large scale is to be started immediately.

This property adjoins the well known Elliott mine now under bond to Duluth and Vancouver capitalists for \$75,000. In the Elliott proposition a development tunnel opened up a continuous ore body over 300 feet long, and according to late advices the hanging wall had not yet been encountered. To the eastward lies the Apex group, another promising proposition, but whose ore body has not yet been partially opened up. The Contact group is traversed by a large low grade body of copper gold ore, through which are interpreted several levels of high grade mineral running from 12 to 30 per cent. copper, gold values ranging up to \$17, and silver \$1 a ton, respectively. The main ore body has been partially opened up by a number of tunnels. The property, according to those who have examined it, is likely to prove a big low grade mine of 1,000,000 tons, with a high level and 4,000 feet from the harbor. The bond was secured by Mr. Cannon from the Bank of Montreal, H. Park, P. O'Connor and W. Williams.

WASHINGTON. SEATTLE, May 16.—O. H. Hallis, manager of the Southern Republic, gave out the following statement this week concerning a new strike made on his property last week: "The strike has been opened up for some distance, and as near as we can tell it will extend to the surface. It was made in a raise we were driving for an air course, and the ore was struck at a depth of about 200 feet. The ledge where first cut averages about three feet in thickness and assays \$19.20 in gold and 128.76 ounces in silver, the value of both contents being \$6.38. We are drifting both ways on the vein to prepare a large slope."

J. L. the Republic mine was in Tacoma this week, where it was arranged with the big Tacoma smelter to increase the monthly ore treatment contract from 2,000 to 3,000 tons. The mine has only been in operation about four months but is the largest shipper of the camp.

The insurance losses sent out an average of two cars a week and are said to have a grade of ore. Grant Stewart and Otto Miller, who are working parts of the Lone Pine ore, have sent out a car every other day. The results are not made public.

G. W. Fairweather, who, with associates, is working the Bon Hur, ship an average of five cars a week. The ore shipments from the mines of Republic for the last three months over the Washington and Great Northern Railway have totalled eighty-six cars, with a tonnage of 3,000 tons. The Spokane and Columbia Railroad sent out 101 cars with a tonnage of 3,800, from January 1 to May 1 of the present year.

There is a strong probability that the Palmer Mountain tunnel will be made use of to reach the copper deposits on the north side of the mountain. The mine is owned by a partner and associates, who own some rich copper property over on that side, seriously contemplate such a move if arrangements can be made with the owners of the tunnel. The plan is declared feasible.

IDAHO. Boise, May 16.—The large placer dredge owned by George Clark has started up for the summer's run. All the hydraulic claims of Boise Basin are in operation with abundance of water.

A lot of new work in the Edna silver mines and mill, between Idaho City and Banner. The mill, which is of one hundred tons daily capacity, is nearly completed.

The White Quartz Company, which owns several quartz mines on Elk Creek in Boise county, has purchased the H. L. Woodburn placer mines and ditches at Idaho City for a cash price of \$125,000.

C. A. Jensen, manager of the Jupiter mountain mines, six miles west of Idaho City, has returned from a visit to the properties, where he had gone to see the strike lately made in the Jupiter vein. The tunnel is 600 feet and in good gold ore. The ledge is a minimum of 100 feet and was found from wall to wall. The Moss Creek company is developing some good ledges near the Jupiter.

The Moss Creek mill, ten miles east of Boise, has started up for a steady run.

MONTANA. BUTTE, May 16.—The sale of the Clark copper property in the Butte district to the Amalgamated Copper Company, which was announced a month ago as being under negotiation, has been consummated and officially confirmed. The sale includes the Original and Stewart group of small mines, fifteen or twenty claims, and the Clark smelter. The transaction is only incidentally connected with the Butte merger. It resulted directly from the controversies that have for some time existed between the Amalgamated and Senator Clark. It became known more than a year ago that Clark's company was mining on Amalgamated ore bodies through the West Stewart shaft, and as a settlement of the controversy the Amalgamated offered to purchase the Clark mines. Senator Clark ceased operations in the Stewart shaft and was willing to turn that property over to the Amalgamated, but the latter insisted on purchasing also the Original, which was surrounded on all sides by Amalgamated mines, and it was certain that only a question of time would bring up more serious controversies between the two groups of mines.
