

AERIAL EYES FOR ARMIES

FRANCE WILL BE TRIED AT THE COMING ARMY MANOEUVRES IN FRANCE RECONSTRUCTING AND DESPATCH CARRYING THE FRENCH AEROPLANES FOR THE NAVY.

It will be tried at the coming Army Manoeuvres in France. Reconstructing and despatch carrying the French aeroplanes for the Navy.

Paris, Aug. 28.—From time to time dispatches to the Sun have told of the progress made by military aviation in France. It now is possible to supply particulars of the French Government's plan for the employment of aeroplanes in the Army.

Gen. Brin, Minister of War, was asked by the French Parliament a few months ago for what was regarded as the most important of the interests of the country in permitting Germany to get together a fleet of dirigible balloons much superior to that of France in both number and strength. Gen. Brin replied that the French Government had not spent large sums of money on dirigible balloons for the simple reason that its aeronautical experts were not convinced of the merits of dirigibles. He and his advisers were of the opinion that the conquest of the air would rest with the aeroplane.

Events since have justified Gen. Brin's policy in a measure. While the dirigible balloon has made little progress in the last few months the aeroplane has developed from a dangerous toy into a practical engine of flight.

Further experiments in Germany have shown that the airship is dirigible, and therefore of military value, only under favorable weather conditions. Other trials have also shown that dirigibles are a target big enough for specially designed guns to hit without much difficulty, unless flying at a great height, owing to their bulk they are not easily transported, and unless shelters are provided they are liable to be injured by any sudden storm.

Their chief value so far, it has been found, lies in the direction of reconnaissance and despatch carrying. Great improvements upon existing types would be necessary before an airship could be of any practical use as a weapon of offence. It is understood that bomb dropping would be its means of attack, but a bomb of sufficient destructive capacity to do any material harm must be a heavy missile, and the sudden release of such a weight would upset the stability and might cause the destruction of any airship at present in existence.

The practical value of the aerial war vessels being confined therefore to reconnaissance and despatch carrying, Gen. Brin contends that the aeroplane has advantages over the dirigible balloon. It is speedier and it is not so much affected by the weather. An aeroplane can fly in a wind that would disable an airship. It is easy to transport and can land almost anywhere.

The aeroplane requires no cumbersome generating plant and is ready for use almost at a moment's notice. It offers a very small target, and should disaster overtake it the loss, both in human life and material, is much less than in the case of the lighter than air vessel. A fleet of aeroplanes can be purchased for the price of one good dirigible balloon.

Thus it is that at the forthcoming manoeuvres in Picardy, beginning on September 10, aeroplanes will be seen for the first time in history as an established division of an army. A couple of dirigible balloons will also be employed, but it is the heavier than air machine that will occupy the chief place in the attention of each military authorities.
