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by the use that has been repeatedly made of the power of injunction in labor disputes.
It cannot be said that these assaults upon the judiciary were without their effect on the public mind.

The moral authority of courts is the foundation of peace, justice and equality in this country. Upon this moral authority they rely, for they have not, like the Executive, a standing army to enforce their decrees.

Possibly no single cause is contributing in so great a degree to the widespread revolt among conservative and self-respecting Republicans as Mr. Roosevelt's contemptuous attitude toward the courts of his country.

Even in the closing weeks of the campaign it is quite clear that there are a few things Republican that the most loyal and regular of Republican organs cannot stomach.

Such Republican journals as the Buffalo Commercial surpass the Post-Standard in frankness in discussing the Timmerman candidacy.

There is no man in the country more deserving of sympathy at this time than the Hon. WILLIAM MCKINLEY, chairman of the Republican Congressional committee.

It is at this point that no humane person can withhold sympathy from Mr. McKINLEY. The getting together of Colonel Roosevelt and the Hon. James S. Sherman in New York is like the clasping of hands of two alien spirits divided by the gulf of the Grand canyon.

As a reward for his subservience and in recognition of the political ends he has served, Mr. PARSONS's master now plans to make him United States Senator.

An overwhelming defeat of the Hon. HERBERT PARSONS will serve in a limited way as a powerful rejection of New Nationalism and an extension to the creature of the condemnation assured for the master.
