OUR SYSTEM OF SCHOOLS.

Address of Commissioner of Education Draper Before the Principals.

SYRACUSE, Dec. 29. Andrew S. Draper, State Commissioner of Education, delivered an address before the Associated Academies Principals in this city today in which he said:

It is true in a peculiar sense that the State of New York has a "system of schools." In this system almost 2,000,000 of young people are now being taught by more than 400,000 teachers. The ends in view are of the very highest importance to the happiness of the people and the prosperity of the State. What are some of the inherent elements which such a great system must have to accomplish these ends?

To have efficiency and power, a system of schools must have capable and universal supervision by scholarly and successful teachers, who on the one hand have the gift of just criticism of systems and the organization and of inspirational leadership, and on the other hand are anxious to serve all the people, are above bigotry, know better than to attempt politics to protect their places and are above the petty and the unproductive part in the intellectual affairs of the community they serve.

A system of schools that applies to and uplifts the life of the people so that they believe in it, that calls out and gathers to itself the support and the strength which all plain people have to give, that builds better and better schoolhouses and steadily improves its housekeeping, that makes for rational living and elevates real scholars along the line that carries its own aim all along the line, that caters to its own needs, that respects the individuality of its pupils, that liberates freedom, and insists upon it for itself and yet attends to its own business, that has clear purpose and makes plans that will work, that is above interference and that respects the point of equilibrium between general leadership and local initiative, between professional and industrial pursuits and between town and country, and that is above party and contains the seeds of its own strength and progress, that is the system of schools which has the inherent elements of educational power.

CITY AND RAILROAD AT ODDS.

Negotiations Between Newark and the Pennsylvania Road Are Off.

The Pennsylvania Railroad Company yesterday declared off its negotiations with the city of Newark for the erection of a new depot at Market street in that city. This action was taken after a conference with the Board of Works at Newark, which came to an abrupt ending when the city officials and the company's representatives were unable to agree as to the conditions of reopening East Mechanic street.

General Superintendent Frank L. Sheppard, who with Albert C. Wall of the Pennsylvania's law department, represented the company, made the announcement that the company withdrew its proposition to the city when President Denman declared that the city would insist either on having its way in the street opening or would proceed to pass a motion of intention to open it by legal means.

Mr. Denman and the railroad men that charge Engineer Shorter of the board had advised that the railroad company had not only closed East Mechanic street without warrant of law or permission from the city but that the company was also a snafu in New Jersey Railroad avenue to the extent of twenty-seven feet west of the tracks, the space occupied by its present passenger station.

The railroad officials did not dispute either claim of the city's engineer, nor did they concede that it was correct. When the board's ultimatum was announced that it would pass a notice of intention to reopen the street, the city announced that the company accepted Mr. Denman's ultimatum and withdrew its own proposition.

On the withdrawal of the railroad representatives the board passed a notice of intention to reopen East Mechanic street.

Beulah Lee to Prison for Swindling Hotels.

Beulah Cooldige, a vaudeville actress known on the stage as Beulah Lee, was sentenced to several months in the penitentiary for swindling hotels. She pleaded guilty to giving a bad check for \$15 to the Astor House on September 17 last. A probation officer showed the court a list of twenty checks from \$5 to \$25 in amount, totalling \$270 that the woman is alleged to have passed to various hotels in New York City. A warrant was obtained at the instance of the Hotel Association of New York. She was arrested at her home at 47 West Twenty-seventh street. Her last appearance on the stage was several years ago.
