An Army of Coal Miners to Gather

Plans for the Coming National Mine Safety Demonstration at Pittsburg.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 16.—Thirty thousand miners were killed in the United States in the last ten years and 75,000 were injured. Eleven thousand women were made widows by the deaths of miners and 2,000 children were left fatherless.
