

COTTON DOLL, STEADY AND SLIGHTLY HIGHER

Market Creeps Upward in Face of Poor Liverpool and Bearish Feeling in Trade.

LOW CONSUMPTION FIGURES

Neill Brothers Estimate Absorption of American Cotton by Spindles at 13,500,000 Bales.

The contradictory character of the cotton market was illustrated by its action yesterday, when with sentiment veering around to the bear side, Liverpool cables disappointing and influences generally in favor of a sagging tendency, the course of prices ran counter to these influences and an irregular advance resulted.

Yesterday's mail brought the latest circular of Messrs. Neill Bros. of London, giving the estimate of consumption of cotton, which they placed at 13,500,000 bales, confirming the estimate of Thomas R. Ellison, the other British authority on consumption.

Fortunately Neill Bros. give details which furnish a basis for their estimate. They put consumption of cotton in Great Britain at 3,175,000 last year and comparing with 3,200,000 in 1910, the previous maximum.

Corn showed microscopic changes, but on the whole was steady. The country roads are declared to be in bad condition and a small movement is expected from the farm.
