

ELABORATE MEMORIAL FOR MAINE DEAD

Navy Department Completes Plans for Services in Washington.

Taft to Deliver Eulogy. Funeral Will Be Most Imposung in Nation's History, Except That of McKinley.

WASHINGTON, March 22.—Memorial services will be held by the United States Government...

The services will be conducted from the broad landing at the south entrance of the State and Navy building.

The remainder of those invited will be seated in campchairs placed on the green sward to the right and left.

This escort will be headed by Rear Admiral Bradley A. Fiske, commander of the Atlantic reserve fleet at the Philadelphia Navy Yard.

Following the army representation will come the naval escort, commanded by Commander C. F. Hughes.

Next will be the naval chaplains officiating and then the caissons escorted by United States Spanish War veterans.

After that will come the cavalry escort of honor, immediately preceding the presidential party.

Next in the procession will come the five aids to the Secretary of the Navy and War and other Cabinet officers.

Following them will be the surviving officers of the Maine present, Rear Admiral Charles D. Sigsbee, retired.

Accompanying the statement was another one from Thomas A. J. Dwyer, an inspector of the Sixteenth Assembly district, who said that he signed a Roosevelt petition and the captain of his election district threatened him with removal "if he didn't agree to do his utmost to thwart the people from voting for the Roosevelt delegates."

Under the law in this State the inspectors represent the county organization and must be removed at any time at the request of its head, no charges being necessary.

MINORITY WOOL BILL SUBMITTED TO HOUSE

Substitute for the Underwood Measure Based on Board's Report.

WASHINGTON, March 22.—A general reduction of 40 per cent. or more on raw wool and the manufacture of wool is proposed in the Republican wool revision bill presented to-day as a substitute for the Underwood bill by the minority members of the Committee on Ways and Means.

The prime purpose of the Republican bill as set forth in a statement made public by Representative Hill is: "First, to make the rates of Schedule K conform to the findings of the Tariff Board, which has been investigating the woolen industry for the last two years all over the world."

The bill combines former class 1 and class 2 wools to a single rate of duty to be known as class 1.

Woolen rags are made dutiable at 2 cents instead of 10 cents.
