

MIKADO IS FIGHTING HARD AGAINST DEATH

Second Rally Follows Release at Noon. When Many Thought End Had Come.

MAKES FOOD AND SLEEPS. Carelessness Felt Regarding Corea Should Prince Accede to Throne.

Alarm was spread through the capital to-day when it was announced from the palace that the condition of the Mikado had taken a sudden change for the worse.

The relapse, which followed a twenty-four hour rally, is thought to have been due to the fact that food had been given to the patient sooner than his condition warranted.

A moderately good night's rest seemed somewhat to have strengthened the imperial patient when he awoke about 6 A. M.

It was also able to swallow a little liquid nourishment. His temperature had fallen, he breathed more freely and his pulse seemed strengthened.

Practically no further hope was entertained at this time, according to the physicians' statements to the Empress, the Crown Prince, Princess Sadako, who waited in adjoining chambers.

The dying ruler's wife snatched a few hours' rest after her husband had fallen asleep, but was awakened, according to her own previous instructions, the moment he opened his eyes, and resumed her vigil.

Princess Yoshihito, strongly urged his own physicians to attend to the Mikado's condition.

LINERS SIGHT BERGS. Two German Ships Swing South to Avoid Drifting Ice.
