JACK JOHNSON'S WIFE DIES

Successor in Hospital to Self Inflicted Pistol Wound.

CHICAGO, Sept. 12.—Etta Terry Johnson, the white wife of the negro heavyweight pugilist, who shot herself early this morning in her rooms above Johnson's cafe, died a few hours later in the Provident Hospital.

Jack Johnson was not in the cafe when the shooting occurred. When the shot rang out Henry Johnson, the pugilist's brother, ordered the orchestra to play loud music and rushed to his sister-in-law's room.

When Johnson returned he appeared much affected by the news that his wife had attempted suicide. He immediately ordered the cafe, which had not been closed at the time of the shooting, locked up.

Etta Terry was a niece of the late John W. Waley, a saloonkeeper on Hampstead, L. I., who had married Tod Duryea, son of John Duryea, a retired fruiterer of Fulton Market.

The couple were married in New York on November 24, 1897, and resided at the Barnard apartments and Breton Hall, where most of their domestic troubles occurred.

They have no children.
