

WILSON PRECONVENTION CAMPAIGN COST \$203,565

More Spent for Democratic Candidate Than for Any of His Rivals.

LAMONT TOLD PARKER Ex-Candidate Testifies About Meeting of Financiers in 1904 to Help Roosevelt.

Yesterday's testimony before the Senate committee completed the statement of expenditures by the managers of the principal candidates in the pre-convention campaigns.

The committee began with William F. McCombs, chairman of the Democratic National Committee, who testified that \$203,565 was spent to nominate Gov. Wilson at Baltimore.

Lieut.-Gov. Hugh L. Nichols of Ohio, who followed Mr. McCombs, testified to expenditures in behalf of Gov. Harmon's pre-convention campaign.

Senator Bankhead of Alabama exposed the Underwood contributions and expenditures to the view of the committee.

Among the disclosures of the day the following stand out most conspicuously: Thomas F. Ryan contributed \$7,000 to Gov. Harmon's campaign fund.

Mr. Dodge turned in \$85,800. He writes McCombs that it was all from Wilson's personal friends.

JUDGE LOVETT ANSWERS CALL. Testified About Only Suit He Knows Of, Dismissed in 1894.

Judge Robert S. Lovett, chairman of the board of the Harriman lines, yesterday replied to Joseph H. Call, attorney of Los Angeles, who has called Judge Lovett's testimony before the Senate campaign fund investigating committee regarding the dismissal of Government suits against Harriman companies in the merger cases.

Judge Lovett said that in his testimony before the committee regarding the dismissal of the merger suits he had given the time to the best of his recollection as being about the time of the Pullman strikes in Chicago, which were around 1894.

Judge Lovett said of these suits that he had no recollection whatsoever. He stood on the court record of 1894 as giving his only knowledge of dismissal of a merger suit against the Southern Pacific.
