

GOV. WILSON STILL DOMINATES STATE

Issues Statement Urging Defeat of Edwards as Candidate for Treasurer.

VISITORS AT TRENTON

Members of Congress Call on Executive—Students Plan Washington Trip.

TRENTON, Jan. 6.—Gov. Wilson began today's work by definitely putting himself on record as opposed to the selection of Edward I. Edwards, a Jersey City banker, for State Treasurer.

Tomorrow is the last "Governor's Day" before the meeting of the Legislature, which will convene next Tuesday.

National Committeeman Robert S. Hinds, who may be named as Floor Leader of Hudson county, has been working with the Governor in getting the legislators into line for Mr. Grosscup, who is chairman of the Democratic State committee.

Representative A. Mitchell Palmer of Pennsylvania, Albert S. Burleson of Texas and Daniel J. McCallum of Maine and Senator Charles F. Johnson of Maine and Judge William Hammond of Atlanta, Ga., visited Gov. Wilson.

Gov. Wilson is to decide whether or not he will have practically the entire student body of Princeton University as his escort on the occasion of his inauguration as President.

PAPAL DELEGATE IN BROOKLYN

Archbishop Bonzano Celebrates Mass in Italian Church.

The Most Rev. Archbishop John Bonzano, the papal delegate came to Brooklyn yesterday from Washington for the special purpose of celebrating mass in the Italian Church of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, at Hicks and Decker streets, in honor of the feast of the Epiphany.

The Archbishop celebrated pontifical mass, assisted by Auxiliary Bishop Mandelini. The ceremonies were conducted in the same way as those which took place in the Church of San Andrea de Valle in Rome. The sermon was preached by the Rev. Francis Molino.

Private Letters of Hawthorne

Mine Promoters Read in Government Suit.

What Dr. William Morton, one of the defendants in the Government suit against the promoters of the Hawthorne Silver and Iron Mines, Ltd., and other mining properties in Canada, thought personally of William H. Hayden, whose report as engineer of the company was sent broadcast to intended subscribers, was contained in correspondence between the doctor and Albert Freeman, another defendant, introduced at yesterday's session of the trial.

"I believe he is a crazy crook," wrote Dr. Morton of Hayden from Temazami, where the doctor was overworking the mining operations of the company. The letter dated August 4, 1909, read as follows:
