

AGUINALDO, JR.'S VISIT TO JAPAN STIRS ARMY

Washington Officers Doubt His Seeking Philippine Independence There.

WASHINGTON, June 17.—Officials of the War Department were greatly interested in a despatch published here to-day that a son of Emilio Aguinaldo, the famous leader of the Philippine insurrection, had arrived in Japan and was conferring with Japanese in regard to the Philippine Islands independence.

The newspaper despatch, which was from Tokio, said that young Aguinaldo had arrived at Kobe, where he talked with many Japanese and that he intended to go to the Japanese capital.

Activities of Japanese in the Philippines have long been a source of anxiety to American authorities in the islands. It has been said by officials in Washington, most competent authorities, that great numbers of Japanese in the employ of the Tokio Government have under various guises visited every district of the Philippine Islands since 1904.

Four Japanese citizens have arrived in Washington in the interest of the Japanese side of the controversy between the United States and that country in regard to the California alien land law.

MAY EXPORTS EXCEED IMPORTS.

Difference This Year Promises to Exceed That of 1908.

WASHINGTON, June 17.—Experts in May, 1913, for which figures have just been completed by the bureau of foreign and domestic commerce, Department of Commerce, reported that the high record total for May of any other year.

There was a marked decline in imports in May of last year. If the June excess of exports approximates that for May, the total excess of exports over imports for the full fiscal year will exceed the former high record.
